A HYMN TO HIGH FASHION



City-wide exhibit across 6 parisian museums


FROM THE LOUVRE TO THE MODERN ART MUSEUM

JANUARY 29TH TO MAY 15TH 2022



To celebrate the 60th anniversary of Yves Saint Laurent's first fashion show, a series of exhibits have been set up to commemorate the designer's work.

Fashion icon and true man of his time, Yves Saint Laurent (1936 - 2008), then 21 years old, succeeded Christian Dior, and founded his own brand just ten years later.



Through his creative style accentuating the beauty of the body's movement, he was poised to become one of the most important designers of his century, all while describing himself as a simple "artisan, a maker of happiness." Ambassador of French elegance, he also sought inspiration outside of Western borders, and introduced the tarbouche, the burnou and the caftan to his audience.

This group of exhibitions is dedicated to the exploration of the designer's inspirations. Saunter through the Musée Picasso's Salon Jupiter to find the mark left by cubism on the autumn/winter collections of 1979. You can also flutter through the artist's archives at the YSL museum, or admire the works of his youth at the Centre Pompidou.

MUSEUM OF DECORATIVE ARTS - UNTIL APRIL 24TH 2022

The Decorative Arts Museum is celebrating the late designer's (1948-2022) work, through a sizeable exhibition recounting his career, creations, and grandiose shows that left their mark on the world of fashion. Stylist for various celebrities, whether it be David Bowie or Céline Dion, or even Jerry Hall, Mugler is also known for his cinema collabroations with stars like Juliette Binoche or Isabelle Hupert.

The exhibit retraces the designer's key collections, like *Insects* and Chimeras, from 1997-1998, displaying an animal world inhabited by extravagant nymphs. Mugler also showed interest in futurist aesthetics, as seen in his robotic cuirasses that transform his models into transhuman beings. Unsurprisingly, we also find sensual vinyl outfits in his wardrobe, tinted with "glamazon" eroticism. The museum offers an immersive and sensorial experience through each of these universes, shining a light on late 20th century fashion's explosive inspiration.

The Galliera Palace invites you to its key event for the coming months: a show-exhibition dedicated to Alber Elbaz (1961-2021). This original format gathers creations from 44 designers presented at the Carreau du Temple on October 5th 2021. The exhibit recreates the world of the man who sought to sublimate the female body through draping. Whether it be through his print, large bow, or ruffle dresses. his creations espouse the movements of flesh. Elbaz worked by the sides of Geoffrey Beene, Guy Laroche and the Lanvin house. The Galliera Palace offers an immersion into the designer's creativitity through «Love Brings Love», a saying now made famous by Elbaz.

Galliera also offers an ode to fashion through the centuries, gathering almost 350 key creations retracing the evolution of trends. The Palace reveals these precious collections in an intimate space, with each section themed upon a specific universe: japanese kimonos in painted cotton, luxurious prints from the 19th century, and famous cocktail dresses from the 1950s, all while passing by great designers like Dior or Poiret.

Charles Ray experiments with gravity, the weight of his subjects and optical illusion. He often finds himself using his own body to convey these illusions in his works, playing with perspective to create a misleading reality.

For spring, the Centre Pompidou and the Pinault Collection forward the enigmatic portfolio putting are contemporary American sculptor Charles Ray. Throughout the 50 years of his career, spectators found themselves enthralled by his sensibility for the sculptural representation of people and other objects. The exhibit gathers troubling and captivating works, that renew the rules of the art and blur the borders between reality and illusion.
